Therefore it is considered that the said John Henry take nothing by his Bill of his but be there of in money for his false clamour and that the said George Howard go thereof without day and also it is considered by the Justices here that the said George Howard recover against the said John Henry three hundred and twenty five pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges by him about
