W<sup>m</sup> Edmond Jennings Esq<sup>r</sup> & C<sup>o</sup> Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that of the goods and  
William Turner - Chattels of Willm<sup>r</sup> Turner late of Somerset County planter otherwise called W<sup>m</sup>  
Turner of Somer<sup>r</sup> County in his baileys with he should make as well as for an<sup>t</sup> debt  
of five thousand pounds of tobacco which Edmond Jennings Esq<sup>r</sup> in his Lordships County Court of Somerset  
before the Justices there of recovered against him as two hundred and Ninety nine pounds of tobacco  
which to the same Edmond Jennings in the same Court were adjudged for his damages which he had -  
by occasion of the detention of that same debt and that he should have that same tobacco before the  
Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be sold at Dividing Court the third Tuesday of  
August then next to satisfy the said amount of his damages as before of his Convict<sup>r</sup>

At Whil<sup>r</sup> said third Tuesday of August to witt the nineteenth day of the same month and day  
One thousand and Seven hundred and Eighty five being the day of the return of the same writ came the said  
Edmond Jennings by William Beechingham his attorney and the Sheriff of  
Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed likewise comette -

of the within named William Turner to y<sup>r</sup> Value of one thousand four hundred  
and fifty pounds of tobacco according to the appraisement thereof made -
