before the Justices there of recovered against him as two hundred and thirty nine pounds of tobacco  
which to the same Edmond Jennings in the same Court were adjudged for his damages which he had  
by occasion of the detention of that same debt and that he should have that same tobacco before the  
Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be sold at dividing from the third Tuesday of  
August then next to satisfy the said Edmond of his damages and to the use of the said Court

At the which said third Tuesday of August to with the nineteenth day of the same month and Down  
One thousand seven hundred & thirty five being the day of the return of the same writt came the said  
Edmond Jennings by William Beechington his attorney and the Sheriff of  
Somerset County to whom the foregoing writt was directed likewise cometh

of the within named William Turner to y<sup>e</sup> Value of one thousand four hundred  
and fifty pounds of tobacco according to the appraisement thereof made  
and returned hereunto annexed
