James Lindow of Somerset County Gent. came here into Court in his proper person and prays that he may have the Liberty to keep Ordinary or a house of Entertainment at his house at the head of Manocan in Somerset County for the ease and Conveniency of the Inhabitants Travellers and Strangers as to them respectively shall seem meet, which is by the Court here granted him he giving good Security according to act of assembly in such cases made and provided &c. Whereupon the said James Lindow with the William Staughton and Samuel Wilson of Somerset County Gent. his Securitys all present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of the Province of Maryland in the sum of five pounds current mony of Maryland of their goods and Chattels Lands and tenements Joyntly and Severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors If it happen that the said James Lindow (and shall) not pay unto his said Lordship the sum of fifty Shillings curr<sup>t</sup> mony of Maryland
