The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and matured deliberation thereupon had wherefore it is considered by the Justices here that a Commission issue to the aforesaid Charles Ratcliff as by the petition aforesaid is prayed and that James Martin Isaac Marshall, Thomas Wallis, and Peter Collier, all of Somerset County Gent. be Commissioners and Execute the same Commission according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

Ordered that Thomas Conington be overseer and clear a road from the Cypress bridge that over the head of Wickhamoro River to the Lewis Gales Mill in Rowkawakin and from thence into the main Road that leads to Handy ferry and that Geo. George Dashiell and Mr John Handy Lay out the said Road the nearest and best way and the least of prejudice to any person or persons whatsoever &c.

Ordered that James Martin and Isaac Morris of Somerset County Gentlemen agree with some person or persons for the Building anew good and Substantial bridge over Nauscougo Creek on Pocumoke if occasion be, otherwise to repair the Old bridge, and that the said James Martin and Isaac Morris to make their Report to Somerset County Court and that the person or persons undertaking the Building or repairing of the bridge aforesaid to be allowed for the same next Levy Court &c.

Ordered that Thomas Gillis and Henry Ballard of Somerset County Gentlemen agree with some person or persons for the building anew good and Substantial bridge over Monohsin River, at the head thereof at Spruces Ann Town, if occasion be, otherwise to repair the Old bridge, and the said Thomas Gillis and Henry Ballard to make their Report to Somerset County Court, and that the person or persons undertaking the Building or repairing of the bridge aforesaid to be allowed for the same next Levy Court &c.
