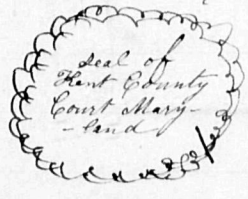

Filed and recorded September 14<sup>th</sup> 1849 and certificate  
of freedom issued as follows  
Maryland Kent County to wit,

I, Joseph Redne, Clerk of Kent County  
Court, hereby certify to all whom it doth or may  
concern, that it appears by the records of Kent  
County aforesaid, that Gynson Smith, Elizabeth  
Smith and Martha H. Griffith, all of the said  
County, by their certain deed of Manumission,  
bearing date on the eighth day of October in the  
year Eighteen hundred and forty eight, did  
manumit, liberate, set free and discharge  
from Slavery a negro woman, named Hannah  
Ringgold about forty years of age - I further  
certify, that a negro woman now present, (the  
bearer hereof) called and known by the name  
of Hannah Ringgold, aged about forty one years,  
five feet three and a quarter inches high with  
a small scar on the forehead and of a dark  
complexion has proved by testimony which is  
satisfactory to me, that she is the identical  
person mentioned and described by the name of  
Hannah Ringgold in the deed of Manumission  
above referred to, and that she was raised in  
Kent County.

In testimony whereof, I hereto  
subscribe my name and affix the  
seal of Kent County Court, this fourteenth  
day of September in the year Eight-  
een hundred and forty nine,
