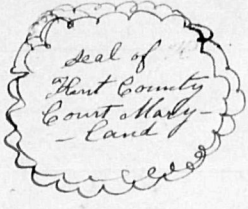

This is to certify that negro Elizabeth Sheppard, who is now present, is the identical person mentioned in a deed of Manumission executed by me this 26th September 1849 and which is filed this day for record — Martha Brice

Filed and recorded September 26th 1849 and certificate of freedom issued as follows Maryland, Kent County, to wit,

I Joseph Redue, Clerk of Kent County Court, hereby certify to all whom it doth or may concern, that it appears by the records of Kent County aforesaid, that a certain Martha Brice of the said County, by her certain deed of Manumission, bearing date on the twenty sixth day of September, Eighteen hundred and forty nine, did manumit, liberate, set free and discharge from slavery a negro woman named Elizabeth Sheppard now about thirty eight years of age, I further certify that a negro woman now present (the bearer hereof) now called and known by the name of Elizabeth Sheppard, aged about thirty eight years, five feet one inch and one quarter of an inch high, of a dark complexion, has
