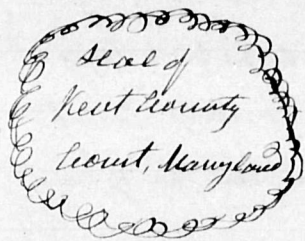


Maryland Kent County Sct.

I Joseph Redue, Clerk of Kent County Court hereby certify, to all whom it doth or may concern that it hath been proved by testimony, which is satisfactory to me, that the bearer hereof a negro man named Jake Walker aged about twenty nine years, five feet eight inches high, of a black complexion, with a small scar above the left eye, was born free, and raised in Kent County, the testimony whereof, I hereto subscribe my name and affix the Seal of Kent County Court, this twenty fourth day of December in the year Eighteen hundred and forty nine,

This is to certify that Richard Frisby, who is now present & applying for a certificate of freedom is the identical person mentioned in a Deed of Manumission, executed by Michael M. Maslin of the City of Philadelphia on the 24th Nov. 1849 & Recorded in Kent County Court Maryland

I Joseph Redue, Clerk of Kent County Court, hereby certify, to all whom it doth or may concern, that it appears by the records of Kent County aforesaid, that a certain Michael M. Maslin, of the said County by his certain Deed of Manumission, bearing date on the twenty fourth day of November in the year Eighteen hundred and forty nine did manumit, liberate, set free and discharge from slavery a negro man named Richard Frisby, born on the twenty fourth day of November in the year Eighteen hundred and nineteen. I further certify, that a negro man now present (The
