

County by his certain deed of manumission, bearing date on the twenty ninth day of December in the year eighteen hundred and forty nine, did manumit, liberate, set free and discharge from slavery a negro woman named Mary Jane, now about thirty three years old, I further certify, that a negro woman now present (the bearer hereof) called and known by the name of Mary Jane, aged about thirty three years, five feet three and a quarter inches high, of a light complexion, and has a small scar in the left eye brow, has proved by testimony, which is satisfactory to me, that she is the identical person mentioned and described by the name of Mary Jane in the deed of manumission above referred to, and that she was raised in Kent County. In testimony whereof, I hereto subscribe my name and affix the seal of Kent County Court, This twenty ninth day of December in the year eighteen hundred and forty nine.
