

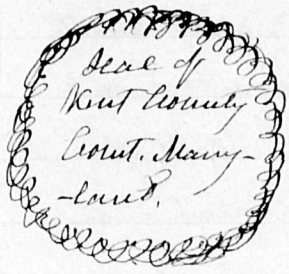
on the thirty first day of December, in the year Eighteen hundred and forty nine, did manumit, liberate, set free and discharge from slavery a negro man named Hensley Emory born on the thirty first day of December in the year eighteen hundred and fourteen, I further certify that a negro man now present (the bearer hereof,) called and known by the name of Hensley Emory aged about thirty five years, five feet ten inches high, of a Black complexion, and has a small scar on the right side of his face, has proved by testimony, which is satisfactory to me, that he is the identical person mentioned and described by the name of Hensley Emory in the deed of manumission above referred to, and that he was raised in Kent County,

In testimony whereof I hereto subscribe my name and affix the seal of Kent County Court, this twenty sixth day of January, in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty,
