Jere is 5 feet 5 inches high dark complexion with a slight scar on the right corner of his mouth

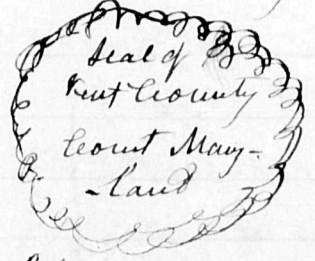

State of Maryland, Kent County Jct.

I, Joseph Redue, Clerk of Kent County Court hereby certify to all whom it doth or may concern, that it appears by the records of Kent County aforesaid, that a certain Henry T. Jump, of the said County, by his certain deed of Manumission, bearing date on the seventh day of January in the year eighteen hundred and fifty did manumit, liberate, set free and discharge from

slavery, a negro man named Jere Beswicks, born on the seventh day of January in the year eighteen hundred and ten. I further certify, that a negro man now present, (the bearer hereof) called and known by the name of Jere Beswicks aged about forty years, five feet, five & 1/2 inches high, of a dark complexion, and has a slight scar on the right corner of his mouth has proved by testimony, which is satisfactory to me, that he is the identical person mentioned and described by the name of Jere Beswicks, in the deed of Manumission above referred to and that he was raised in Kent County.



In testimony whereof, I hereto subscribe my name and affix the seal of Kent County Court, this eleventh day of February in the year eighteen hundred and fifty.
