I further certify, that a Mulatto woman, now present, (the bearer hereof,) called and known by the name of Mary Freeman aged about twenty eight years, five feet & a half inch high, of a very light complexion, and has a small scar on the left eye lid, has proved by testimony, which is satisfactory to me, that she is the identical person mentioned and described by the name of Mary Freeman in the deed of manumission above referred to, and that she was raised in Kent County,
