This is to Certify that a negro man named Wilson Woodland now present and applying for a certificate of freedom is the identical negro man who was manumitted by Francis Putter by deed of manumission dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of April 1845 and recorded in Liber J. N. G. No 3 page 511 one of the Record books of Kent County. — In said deed of manumission, said negro man is named and mentioned by the name of "Wilson", aged about twenty four years, to be free on the twenty fifth day of December eighteen hundred and forty five" — Said negro man is of a black complexion about five feet six inches high, and has no remarkable scar about him that I know of. Given under my hand this 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1850.
