

Will & Testament of a certain Philip Fadde man¹⁰²
duly executed on the 18th day of July in the year 1821
and proved in my Office on the 22nd day of January 1822,
a certain Negro Man named Hanibal, of a dark com-
plexion, five feet one inch and a half in height, a scar
on his cheek near the lower part of his right ear, also
two slight scars on his breast, and a scar just above
the cap of his left knee, was manumitted and set free.

His freedom to commence on the first day of January
next after the decease of the said Philip Fadde man

Testament of the said Philip Fadde man; Given

Whereas a certain Negro Man named
Dowdall, who calls himself Dowdall Thompson
has made application to me for a certificate of
freedom, under an act of the General Assembly of
Maryland, passed at Nov session 1805 - I do therefore
certify to all persons whom it doth or may concern
that by the last Will & Testament of a certain William
L Brown, duly executed on the 1st day of April 1808 and
proved in my Office on the 14th day of June in the
same year, a certain Negro Man named Dowdall
of a dark complexion 5 feet six inches & three
fourths of an inch in height, has lost the sight of
his right eye, a small scar on his left arm just
above the wrist joint, thin visage and bad teeth
was manumitted and set free - His freedom
