Whereas Application has been made
to me by a certain Negro Man named Perry, for
a certificate of freedom under an Act of the General
Assembly of Maryland, passed at November Session
1805. — I do therefore certify to all persons whom it
doth or may concern, that by the last Will & Testament
of a certain Susan Sedler duly executed on the 17th day
of October 1807 and proved in my Office on the 19th
day of December in the same year, a certain Negro
Man named Perry, complexion black, five feet six
inches and a half in height, his face very much marked
with the small pox, has a large scar on the left side
of his face very near his left ear, and a large scar
on his right leg just below the knee — was manumitted
and set free. — At the time of the execution of the
said will, the said Negro Perry was stated to be
eight years old, his freedom to commence when
he shall have attained the age of twenty six
