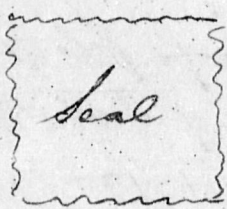

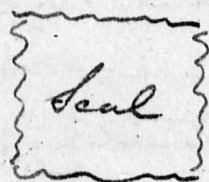

State of Maryland, Queen Anns County To wit

Whereas a certain Negro Man named
London, has made application to me for a certificate
of freedom, under an Act of the General Assembly
of Maryland, passed at November Session 1805

I do therefore certify to all persons whom it doth
or may concern, that by the last Will & Testament of
a certain Susan Butler, duly executed on the 17th
day of October 1807 and proved in my Office on the
19th day of December in the same year, a certain
Negro Man named London, 5 feet 8 Inches in height
complexion black, his right Ankle much larger than
the left, said to have been Occasioned by a Sprain,
was manumitted and set free; his freedom to commence
when he shall have arrived at the age of twenty six years

His person identified by the Oath of a certain
Benj. W. Ericsson who also states that the said Negro
Man London had attained the age of twenty six years,
the ~~time~~^{period} limited for his time of service. — Given under

Office, this 9th day of May Anno
Domini 1826
