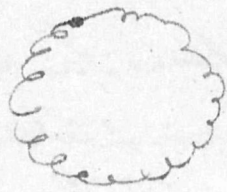


and three quarters of an inch in height, three small <sup>130</sup> scars

and proved in my Office on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April  
Eighteen hundred and seven - Her freedom to com-  
mence in twenty years from the date of the said Will  
Her person was identified by a certain Doct John  
Davidy Emory, who was the Executor of the said Arthur

Whereas application has been made to me by a  
certain Negro woman named Betty, who calls herself  
Betty Cain, for a certificate of freedom under an Act of  
the General Assembly of Maryland passed at November  
Session 1805. - I do therefore certify to all whom it may  
concern, that a certain Negro woman named Betty now  
about 33 years of age, dark complexion 5 feet 5 inches  
and a quarter in height, a Scar near the corner of her  
left eye brow, also a Scar just above the elbow of her  
right Arm, slender made and has lost one of her upper  
fore teeth, was manumitted and set free by the last Will  
and Testament of a certain Philip Feddemans, duly  
executed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1821 and proved in my  
Office on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of Jan'y 1822 - Her freedom to  
commence on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Jan'y next after the  
decease of the said Philip Feddemans - Her
