I do hereby certify that a certain Negro man named William Cook, aged about twenty three years, of a black complexion, five feet four and a half inches in height, a scar on his right wrist, has a full mouth of teeth, was manumitted and set free by the last Will and Testament of a certain Solomon Cotton, late of Queen Anne County, deceased duly executed on the 21<sup>st</sup> February 1793, leaving the Grand Mother of said Negro man William free at the death of his woman and all her increase and the increase of her daughters - admitted to probat in my Office the 18<sup>th</sup> day of November 1795 - his freedom to commence at the time of his birth, being born after the death of his master, and his person being identified by the evidence of a certain Samuel Kirby -

Maryland Queen Anne County to wit

I hereby certify that a certain Negro man named Wells, aged 26 years, five feet 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches high very black, has a scar on his nose and one on his left Whist, was manumitted and set free by the last Will and Testament of a certain Frances Emory, dated on the 30 March 1822, and admitted to probat in my Office on the 24 September 1822, and his freedom to commence on the 4 May 1840, his person being identified by the evidence of William C. Burley.
