

Maryland Queen Anne's County to Wit

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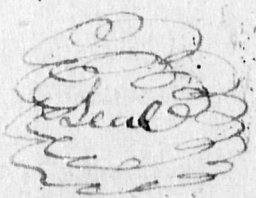
I hereby certify that a Certain negro man <sup>The issue of Slavery</sup> named ~~Frederick~~ <sup>Frederick</sup> now about thirty one & a half years old, five feet seven inches high of light complexion and has two remarkably large scars on his breast was manumitted and set free by the last will and testament of a certain ~~Beaumont~~ <sup>Beaumont</sup> ~~Slincy~~ <sup>Slincy</sup> dated on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1805 and admitted to probat<sup>in my office</sup> on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of June 1805. his freedom to commence ~~at~~ <sup>at</sup> the age of thirty years. his person identified by the evidence of a certain Perc Minchested.

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I hereby certify that a certain mulatto woman named Mary now about twenty seven years old five feet four and a quarter inches high and has the fore finger of her left hand broken, was manumitted & set free by the last will and testament of a certain Philemon Spenser dated 19<sup>th</sup> June 1828 & admitted to probat<sup>in my office</sup> in my office July 8<sup>th</sup> 1828. Her freedom to commence at the expiration of the Year eighteen hundred & forty four. her person identified by the evidence of a certain Bennett Downs.
