 Whereas application has this day been made to me by certain
 Negro Woman named Beth, or Elizabeth for a certificate of her being
 a free person, I do therefore hereby certify to all persons whom it
 doth or may concern that by the will and Testament of a
 certain William Bebout at late of Queen Anne's County deceased
 duly executed on the thirteenth day of November Eighteen hun-
 -dred and seven and proved in my office on the fourth day of
 April Eighteen hundred and Eight, a certain Negro Woman
 named Beth, of a dark complexion five feet two inches and $\frac{5}{8}$
 high, about thirty five years of age, has a scar over the left
 Eye between the lid and brow, has a scar on the left arm
 every much pitted, by the small pox was manumitted
 and set free her freedom to commence on the thirty first day
 of December 1814 her person identified by the oath of
 a certain Mrs Elizabeth Farwine of this
 In Testimony &c this 30 June 1818

 I do hereby certify to all persons whom it doth or may concern
 that by the will and Testament of a certain Richard Hall
 late of Queen Anne's County deceased duly executed on the 27th day
 of April 1809 and proved in my office on the 3rd day of June
 1809 a certain Negro Man named Greenbury of a dark
 complexion about twenty two years of age five feet eight inches
 high, has a scar on the inside of the right hand, has had his ears
 pierced a small scar on the forehead - Was manumitted and
 set free his freedom to commence after his having served nine
 years from the date of the said will and his person identified
 by the oath of a certain Thomas Meredith
 July 18. 1818 - Certified by Thos. Earle J. P.
