Negro woman named Joby of a dark complexion,
five feet five & one fourth inches in height, a slight
scar on the fore finger of the right hand stout made,
was manumitted & set free by the last will & Testament
of the said John Dodd - her freedom to commence
on the first day of January next ensuing after his
death. Her person identified by a certain Daniel
Newman. Given under my hand & Seal this 16th
day of October Anno Domini 1822.

The Estate of Dodd proved
unsolvent & Joby was sold, believe,
by John Bayge -

Whereas a certain Negro Man named
Laxerus, has made Application to me for a Certificate
of freedom, under an act of the General Assembly
of Maryland, passed at November Session 1805.

I do therefore Certify to all whom it doth
or may concern, that by the last will & Testament
of a certain John Hason, late of ^{the City of Annapolis} ~~Queen Anns County~~
deceased, duly executed on the 26th day of December
1805 and proved in the Office of the Register of Wills
for Anne Arundel County, on the 4th day of January
1806, a copy of which has been received & recorded
on the Records of the Orphans' Court for Queen Anns
County, a certain Negro Slave named Laxerus of a
black complexion, five feet six inches in height, a slight
scar near the corner of the left eye, a little below the
eye brow, also a scar near the left corner of his mouth
and a large scar on the lower part of the back of his
neck, was manumitted & set free by the last will & Tes-
tament of the said John Hason, his freedom to commence
in seventeen years from the death of the said John Hason.
