Whereas a certain Negro Man named Noah Aces, has made application to me for a certificate of freedom, under an act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at November Session 1855.

I do therefore certify to all whom it doth or may concern, that the indentures of a certain Negro Boy named Noah Aces, an orphan or free black child aged fourteen years on the 29th day of January 1812, bound by and with the consent of his Mother Ann Aces, unto Greenbury Coarman, farmer, until the said Noah shall arrive to the age of twenty one years, was recd by the Orphans' Court for Queen Anne's County at the February Term in the year 1812, which said Negro Noah Aces is identified this day by Greenbury Coarman, the person to whom he was bound, and is of the following description
 W^o of a dark complexion, five feet four inches and one fourth of an inch in height, a little knock-kneed, a scar on the right cheek bone and a small scar on his chin. Given under my hand and the seal of my office, this 6th day of January Anno Domini Eighteen hundred and twenty four
