

86 State of Maryland, Queen Anne County, To Wit

Whereas a certain Negro Man named Tom Bain, has made Application to me for a certificate of freedom, under an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at November Session 1805

I do therefore certify to all whom it doth or may concern, that by the last Will & Testament of a certain Philip Feddeiman, duly executed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year 1821 and proved in my Office on the 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1822, a certain Negro Man named Tom Bain, of a very dark complexion, five feet eight inches long fourth of an inch in height, straight and well made, a slight scar near the corner of his right eye brow, also one on his left breast, a little inclined to stammer usually wears large whiskers, was bequeathed to Philip Henry Feddeiman, to serve him the said Philip Henry Feddeiman, until he the said Tom Bain, shall attain the age of twenty eight years.

His person is identified by the said Philip Henry Feddeiman, who at the same time states that the freedom of the said Negro Man Tom Bain, commenced on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1823. Given under my hand & the seal of my Office this 5<sup>th</sup> day of May anno Domini 1834
