The clerk of the Council delivered the following communication

from the Executive:

Executive Department, Annapolis Dec. 28th, 1837.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

In compliance with your order of this morning, requesting us to communicate to you the correspondence, if any had, between us and the President of the United States, and the Executives of the several States of this Union interested in the cultivation of Tobacco, in pursuance of the Resolution of the General Assembly in reference to negotiation proposed to be had with foreign nations upon the subject of diminishing the duties on Tobacco, and all our proceedings under said Resolution, we transmitted a copy of the Preamble and Resolutions referred to, to the President of the United States, to the Governors of several of our sister States, having a common interest with Maryland in the important object, and to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
