

On motion of Mr. Iglehart,

Ordered, that the committee on claims have leave to set for the transaction of business during the hours of the sitting of the house.

Mr. Beam presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying for the passage of an act authorising the appointment of weigh-master for live stock, particularly neat cattle;

Which was read and referred to the committee on agriculture.

The doorkeeper having returned reported that in obedience to order he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required;

The house then proceeded to the election of a Governor, in conformity with the arrangements made with the senate for that purpose, and the ballots of the members being collected in the ballot box, it was sealed up and delivered to the committee appointed on the part of the house, to meet the committee appointed on the part of the senate, to count the joint ballots of both houses and report the result;

They having retired to the conference room, after a short time returned and reported. that on counting the joint ballot of both houses, they had found there were altogether eighty-one votes taken, of which number Thomas W. Veazey, Esq. received fifty-two votes, five scattering and twenty-four blank ballots;

Whereupon it was resolved, that Thomas W. Veazey, Esq., be and he is hereby declared to be duly elected Governor of the State of Maryland for the ensuing year.

Mr. Geyer moved that the house adjourn;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Maulsby moved that the house adjourn;

Resolved in the affirmative.

The house accordingly adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
