

Jenkins and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a change in the act of Assembly, passed in 1836, ch. 261, with regard to the rates of toll allowed to be charged on bark, carried on the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road,

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Giles also presented a petition of John B. Morris and R. W. Gill, praying for an act to divide certain turnpike road stock into shares,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Grason presented a petition of Thoms C. Earl, of Queen Anne's county, praying a reimbursement for certain expenses therein mentioned,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Grason, Harrison, and Wilmer.

And Mr. Carroll presented a petition of John W. B. Parsons, of Somerset county, praying that he may be permitted to sell the unexpired term of a servant therein mentioned,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

And Mr. Giles presented a memorial of Amos A. Williams and James Harwood, on behalf the directors appointed by the State, in the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company,

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

Ordered, that it be noted on the journal that the absence of Mr. Orrick is occasioned by the indisposition of his family.

Mr. Boyle, of Talbot, obtained leave to bring in a bill to alter and change the name of Anthony Christopher Columbus Americus Vespuccious Thompson, of Talbot county, to that of Absalom Christopher Columbus Americus Vespuccious Thompson.

Ordered, that Messrs. Boyle, of Talbot, Jump, of Talbot, and Deny report the same.

Mr. Giles asked leave to bring in a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act relating to justices of the peace in and for the city of Baltimore,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion of Mr Mann,

Ordered, that the committee on claims be instructed to enquire into the propriety of allowing the account of capt. Abraham Barnes, of the Clear Spring Horse Guards, for services rendered in quelling the riots on the canal.

On motion of Mr. Townsend,

Ordered, that the committee on education enquire into the propriety of allowing to Berlin Academy, in Worcester county, a donation of two hundred dollars.
