So the house refused to permit said protest to be entered on the journal.

Mr. White submitted the following preamble and resolutions:

Whereas, the Medical department of the University of Maryland, an institution of great value to the citizens of Maryland, is in need of the aid of the government, and is eminently worthy of the public patronage—Therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, on the first day of April next, and on the first day of April following, to end with the first day of April 1839, place in the treasury to the credit of the Medical Professors of the University of Maryland, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, as an annual donation by this State to the Faculty of Physic of said University; and that the future execution of the 7th section of the act of December session, 1821, ch. 88, be by the said treasurer discontinued, from the first day of April, 1837, to the first day of April, 1839, inclusive, and no longer; provided always, that the said annual donation shall be applied by the said treasurer, in behalf of the said Medical Professors, to the payment of the interest which will have accrued on the first day of April next, for the year then ended, and to accrue on the first day of April, 1839, on the debt of the State heretofore contracted, in pursuance of the act aforesaid, for the advancement of said institution.
