Also, the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Somerset Silk Company;

Severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;"

Which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolution in favor of Priscilla Woolford;

And, the resolution requiring the Armorer to deliver to Capt. Henry S. Sanderson, certain arms therein mentioned;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and the resolutions ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolution directing the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay to the trustees of St. Jame's Academy, in Baltimore county, three hundred dollars, and to Carroll Academy, in Carroll county, one hundred dollars, &c.;

And, the resolution in favor of Sarah Callahan, severally endorsed, "dissented from."

And, delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the senate, viz:

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Townsend, Hearn and Selby.

A bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act to promote Internal Improvement, by the construction of a Rail Road from Baltimore to the city of Washington;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal improvement.

A bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, passed at Dec. session, 1823, ch. 188;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the militia.

And, a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Globe Insurance Company of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

By the Senate,

March 14th, 1838.
