Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Carroll, the house took up for consideration the bill referred to in said message, entitled, an act to provide for the instruction of indigent blind persons, inhabitants of this State;

On motion of Mr. Carroll, said bill was amended by striking out in the third line, of 1st section, these words, "any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated," and inserting in lieu thereof, the following, "the interest upon the Surplus Fund now belonging to the State of Maryland."

The said bill was then passed as amended.

Mr. Carroll submitted the following message, which was read, and assented to:

We have adopted your suggestions in relation to the bill, entitled, an act to provide for the instruction of indigent blind persons, inhabitants of this State, and respectfully request that you will pass the same.
