**REPORT:**

That it has been the uniform custom of this house, in the absence of the doorkeeper by indisposition, to substitute his place by calling in some person to act as doorkeeper during his absence, and to pay him the per diem allowance; and as the aforesaid Allen Quynn performed all the duties required of the doorkeeper, your committee are of opinion, that it is right and proper that the said Allen Quynn should be remunerated—Therefore,

Ordered, that the committee on claims allow to Allen Quynn, the per diem allowance, for fourteen days services as doorkeeper to this house.
