Mr. Hillen moved to amend said amendment by striking out, and inserting "one hundred thousand,"

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said amendment was then adopted as amended.

On motion of Mr. Hillen, said bill was further amended by adding at the end of 3d section these words, "as the directors of said academy may direct."

On motion of Mr. Williams, said bill was further amended by adding at the end of the 8th section the following—"until it be otherwise directed by law."

The said bill was then read the second time as amended and passed

The house then resumed the consideration of the preamble and resolutions from the senate, relative to the currency of the United States.
