Mr. Parker reported a bill, entitled, an act to exempt the sheriff of Cecil county, from the collection of officers' fees;

Mr. Parker, from the committee on colored population, reported a bill, entitled, an act to permit Ruth Hyland and Henry Hollingsworth, of Cecil county, to manumit certain persons of color therein mentioned;

Also, reported a bill, entitled, an act to permit Ruth Hyland and Edward Hyland, of Cecil county, to manumit certain persons of color therein named;

And, reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to provide for electing commissioners for Cecil county, by districts, and prescribing their powers and duties, and repealing an act and its supplements therein mentioned, passed at December sessions, 1831, chap. 164;

Mr. Williams reported a bill, entitled, an act relating to the summoning of jurors,

Mr. Sprigg, chairman of the committee on internal improvement, reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the promotion of internal improvement;

Mr. Townsend reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Worcester county court, to record a deed therein mentioned;—and

Mr. Causin reported a bill, entitled, an act in favor of Count Julius De Menou;
