The bill reported by Mr. Williams, entitled, an act relating to the removal of criminal causes for trial, to an adjoining county;

Was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Williams, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Maulsby, entitled, an act to repair injuries done by fire from Rail Road Engines;

The bill reported by Mr. White, entitled, an act to incorporate the Carrollton Exploring and Mining Company;

The bill reported by Mr. Gallagher, entitled, an act for the protection of firemen, and of the property of the fire companies in the city of Baltimore;

Was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Gallagher, said bill was amended by inserting after the word "Baltimore," in the second line, 3d section, the following—"and the Presidents of the several fire companies;"

The said bill was then read the second time as amended and passed.

Was taken up for consideration;

Mr. Duke moved to amend said report by striking out in the resolution, the word "thirty," and inserting in lieu thereof "ten;"

Determined in the negative.
