Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the incorporation of the Great Council of Maryland of the Improved Order of Red Men;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Watchman's Beneficial Society of Baltimore;

Severally endorsed, 'will pass with the proposed amendments;'

Which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce James H. Knotts, of Queen Anne's county, from his wife Catharine Knotts;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise Mrs. Mary Bond and John McKenney, to manumit certain negroes;

Severally endorsed, 'will not pass.'

A bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of George Hilderbrand;

Which was read and referred to the committee on insolvency.

A bill, entitled, an act allowing a case to be re-instated in Baltimore county court;
