Mr. Parran submitted the following resolution—

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Inspector of the State's Tobacco Warehouse, No. 4. in the city of Baltimore be, and he hereby is directed to reserve the garret floor of the said warehouse for the purpose of shaking out stayed or other condemned tobacco, or so much of the said garret as may be necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and that permission be given by the said inspector to any person engaged in the business of reconditioning such tobacco, to use the said garret or so much thereof as may be necessary therefor, without fee or reward.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time and assented to.

Mr. Carter submitted the following resolution—

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Marcy Fountain and his several securities on his bond or bonds, as collector for Caroline county, for the years 1825 and 1826, be and the same are hereby released from the payment of all interest which has accrued on said bond or bonds, and the Attorney General or his deputy is hereby authorised to strike from the docket of Caroline county court, any judgment or judgments which are now standing against the said Fountain and his securities on his said bond or bonds, as collector for Caroline county in the years aforesaid; provided it shall be satisfactorily proved to the said Attorney General or his deputy, that the whole debt on said bond or bonds has been fully, paid (except the interest) together with the costs of any judgment or judgments which may have been obtained against the said Fountain and his securities.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.
