

## FOUR O'CLOCK, P. M.

The house met.

Mr. Parker presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying an additional Magistrate's court for the second election district of said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Parker, Comegys and Simpser.

Mr. Sprigg presented a memorial of John Stoddart, praying that the name of his son Andrew Jackson Stoddart, may be changed to that of John Marshall Stoddart;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Sprigg, Neff and White.

The bill reported by Mr. Powder, entitled, an act to provide for the promotion of justice, by a resale of property in certain cases therein mentioned, in Carroll county;

The bill reported by Mr. Welch, entitled, an act to regulate the compensation of judges of the levy court, commissioners of the tax and witnesses, in Kent county;—and

The bill reported by Mr. Maulsby, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act empowering the commissioners of Harford county to build a bridge over Winters' Run in said county, at or near the place where the road leading from Gunpowder neck to Belle-Air, crosses said Run, passed at Dec. session, 1830;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, and severally passed.

On motion of Mr. Bowie, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of Tobacco;

Mr. Bowie moved to amend said bill by striking out the 6th section and inserting in lieu thereof, the following:

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, that the salaries of the said inspectors shall be as follows, to wit—an annual salary of twelve hundred dollars to each inspector of tobacco in the city of Baltimore, as now provided for by law; five hundred dollars per annum to each inspector of tobacco in Prince George's county; three hundred dollars per annum to each inspector in Charles county; three hundred dollars per annum to each inspector in Anne Arundel county; two hundred dollars per annum to each inspector in Calvert county, and two hundred dollars per annum to each inspector in St. Mary's county; and such other sum or sums as may hereafter be provided for by law, for the inspectors of tobacco in those counties where tobacco warehouses may hereafter be erected; which said salaries shall be paid quarterly to said inspectors, respectively, by the treasurer, out of the annual revenue accruing to the State from the said warehouses; and not more than one inspector shall be appointed for any one warehouse.

Which was read.

Mr. Turner of Baltimore county, called for a division of the question which was put upon striking out,—and

Determined in the negative.
