So the house refused to reject the amendment.

The question then recurred upon the amendment to the amendment as offered by Mr. Williams;

Mr. Williams (by permission of the house) withdrew his amendments.

Mr. Simmons then moved to amend said bill, by adding at the end thereof as an additional section, the following:

Be it enacted, that this act shall not go into operation until at the end of the next regular session of the General Assembly.

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Williams, the first section of said bill was amended, by striking out these words, 'from and after the fourth day of July next.'

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Ely, the title of said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof, the following—'from and after the end of the next annual session of the General Assembly.'

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act relating to poor children in Queen Anne's county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce John Jacobs, of Frederick county, from his wife Christiana Jacobs;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Dorchester county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Harford county to settle certain claims therein mentioned;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the laying out and opening a road in Worcester county, therein mentioned;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act relating to indigent out pensioners in Queen Anne's county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Frederica Meyer, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband George Meyer;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce William R. Sheffield, of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Mary Elizabeth Sheffield;

Severally endorsed 'will pass,' and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to establish Magistrates' courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, so far as it relates to Dorchester county;

Endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendment;'

Which amendment was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favor of the securities of Marcey Fountain, on his collector's bond or bonds;

Endorsed 'assented to,' and the resolution ordered to be engrossed.
