bill, entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of Assembly which would expire with the present session of the General Assembly,

And Mr. Parran reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of the tax of Calvert county to invest a certain sum of money;

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on

the table.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to divorce James Weston, of Talbot county, from his wife Ann J. Weston;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Lombard Ho-

tel Company;

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to abolish the office of the commissioners of the tax for Charles county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Alexander Dono-

ho, of Somerset county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to limit the number of constables in the several election districts in Anne Arundel county, and to increase their fees;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to provide for the payment of ju-

rors in Carroll county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act authorising John E. Taylor, to bring into this State, a negro boy named Lewis;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of the administrator

of Preston McComas, late sheriff of Harford county;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to make a public landing and road

therein mentioned;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Port Deposite Rail Road Company, passed December session, 1831, ch. 288;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to enlarge the powers of the com-

missioners of Baltimore county;

Severally endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments;' Which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act declaratory of the law concerning

contempts of court; -endorsed 'will not pass.'

And, delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the senate—viz.

A bill, entitled, an act to guard against fraud in the exercise of the elective franchise in the city of Baltimore, and to secure the rights of voters, and to establish with greater certainty the rules of evidence to be observed at all elections in said city;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed

on that subject.
