So the bill was passed. On motion of Mr. Berret, The house adjourned until to-morrow morning nine o'clock.

SATURDAY, March 24th, 1838.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. On motion of Mr. Gallagher, the rule of the house which requires the journal of proceedings or the preceding day to be read, was suspended, and the reading of said journal was dispensed with.

The speaker announced the following message as having been

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Charlestown, in Cecil county, to sell and convey a certain lot of

ground therein mentioned;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to prevent unnecessary costs in

cases of appeal;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the better preservation of the

estates of minors in the hands of their guardians;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise Robert W. Harper, of Prince George's county, to carry with him to the State of Mississippi, a certain negro who is a slave for a term of years;

Severally endorsed "will not pass."

Also, the resolutions relative to the currency;

Endorsed "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed.

And, delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the senale, viz:

A bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of William Walker, a mi-

nor, in the State of Georgia;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.
