Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate

Mr. Sprigg, chairman of the committee on internal improve

ment, delivered the following report,

The committee on internal improvements, to whom was referred the memorials of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying that it may be made "obligatory on the Maryland Canal Company to locate and construct their canal by the way of Seneca and Patuxent rivers," &c. have had the same under consideration, and in conformity with an order of this house, have examined Messrs. Hughes, Fisk and Trimble, engineers, on oath—but inasmuch as the prayer of the memorialists has been mainly gratified by the subsequent adoption of a resolution directing a particular survey of those routes, your committee beg leave to report the testimony, and ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the subject.

Mr. Carpinter, chairman of the committee on corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Mining Manufacturing and Rail Road Company of Hibernia;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Bowie, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act for the benefit of William Walker, a minor, in the State of Georgia;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Causin, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act in behalf of Count Julius De Menou;

'On motion of Mr. Causin, said bill was amended by striking out 'Count,' and inserting in lieu thereof 'Charles;'

The said bill was then read the second time as amended and passed.

On motion of Mr. Causin, the title to said bill was amended by striking out 'Count,' and inserting 'Charles;'

The said bill was then sent to the senate.
