

On motion of Mr. Carroll, the house took up for consideration the message submitted by him on yesterday, in relation to the final adjournment of the legislature;

Mr. Carroll (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority) moved to reconsider that part of said message fixing Saturday the 31st inst. for the adjournment;

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Carroll then moved to fill the blank with Thursday next the 29th inst.

Mr. Giles moved to fill the blank with Friday next the 30th inst. Determined in the negative.

Mr. Maulsby moved to lay the message on the table;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred upon the motion of Mr. Carroll, to fill the blank in said message with Thursday the 29th inst.

And resolved in the affirmative.

The said message was then read the second time as amended, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Gallagher presented a memorial of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, praying the passage of a law to regulate the right of removal in criminal cases, from Baltimore city and county courts;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Carroll White Sulphur Spring Company, in Allegany county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to regulate the compensation of judges of the levy court, commissioners of the tax, and witnesses, for Kent county;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favor of Ann Lorentz—endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favor of the heirs of Col. John H. Stone,—endorsed "dissented from:"

And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act to authorise Juliet Done to bring into this State her slave Jane,

Which was read and referred to the committee on coloured population:

By the Senate,

March 23, 1838.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We herewith return to your honorable body the resolution in favor of Battle Creek Academy.
