Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Armourer at Annapolis be, and he is hereby required to deliver to Captain James Hooper, of Worcester county, any clean muskets and equipments not exceeding seventy-five each, which the said armourer may select, on his giving bond and security for the safe keeping and return of the same to the State, as the Governor may require.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.
