A bill, entitled, an act to enable Hanson Jones, a free man of color to bring into Washington county, his wife, Priscilla Hanson, formerly Priscilla Johnson, a woman of color,

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and returned in the Senate—And,

A bill, entitled, an act to amend and explain an act, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to provide for the public instruction of youth in Primary Schools throughout this State, passed December session 1825, ch. 162, so far as relates to Montgomery county.
