Mr. Gallagher moved further to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof as an additional section the following—

'Sec. 27. And be it enacted, That from and after the first day of January, eighteen hundred and forty, the convicts in said institution shall not be employed in any mechanical or manufacturing branch of labor, but shall be kept in solitary confinement and furnished with moral and religious instruction.'

Determined in the negative.

The said bill having been read through as amended,

The question was put—shall the said bill pass,

Resolved in the affirmative.
