On motion of Mr. Maulsby, the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the doorkeeper.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act in relation to the stock formerly held by the Bank of Maryland in certain turnpike road companies;

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act to prevent the destruction of oysters in the waters of this State, passed at Dec. session 1833, ch. 254;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act in behalf of Charles Julius Demenow;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to change the name of Anthony Christopher Columbus Americus Vespuccius Thompson, of Talbot county,

Severally endorsed, 'will pass,' and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act for the encouragement of primary schools in Prince Georges county,—endorsed, 'will pass with the proposed amendment,'

Which amendment was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county to appoint trustees to the poor,—endorsed, 'will not pass;'

Also, the resolution in favour of Martha Kelly,—endorsed, 'reconsidered and dissented from;'

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the senate, viz:

A bill, entitled, an act to divorce Catharin C. Oldfield, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Thomas W. Oldfield,

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

A bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant heirs of Preston McComas, late of Harford county deceased,

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and returned to the senate;

And a bill, entitled, an act authorising Charles Carroll, of Anne Arundel county, to bring into this State certain negroes, slaves for life,

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time.

Mr. Alexander moved to amend said bill by striking out the last section thereof,

Resolved in the affirmative.
