

aforesaid, for the redemption of the stock to be issued as aforesaid, and until the principal sum of money required to be paid by the said company as aforesaid shall have been actually repaid into the treasury, and until the sinking fund to be created as herein before provided, shall have become equal to the redemption of the aforesaid stocks.'

On motion of Mr. Alexander, said bill was further amended by adding at the end of the 4th section the following:

'Provided nevertheless, that no part of this act shall be of any force or effect whatever until after it shall have been shown to the Treasurer for the Western Shore that the city of Baltimore has agreed, by ordinance of its Mayor and City Council, to accept this act and the provisions thereof as a fulfilment, on the part of this State, of the conditions proposed by its ordinance, entitled, 'a supplement to the ordinance to provide for a loan of certificates of city stock to the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, approved 10th April 1837,' and thereby has declared the obligation of the said city to deliver to the said company certificates of stock of said city to the amount of \$250,000, in the manner and form therein prescribed, is absolute and unconditional; and provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be construed in any manner to impair the rights or priorities secured to this State as a creditor of the aforesaid company by the provisions of the act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for the completion of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road to the Borough of York, in the State of Pennsylvania, passed at December session 1834, chapter 231, excepting in so far as the said rights or priorities are hereby expressly postponed in favour of the city of Baltimore and this State, to secure the payment of the interest on the loans to be made to the said company by the said city and this State as is herein before provided.'

The said bill having been read through as amended,

The question was put—shall the said bill pass?

Resolved in the affirmative.
