So the bill was passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Alexander (by leave of the house) gave notice that he should on to-morrow, move that the 49th rule of the house be suspended for the remainder of the present session, so far as it would have effect or operation on the 40th and 42d rules of the house.

Mr. Geyer presented a petition of W. Ross, counter to a peti-

tion therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances

and courts of justice.

Mr. Geyer also presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, remonstrating against the passage of a law as prayed for by certain petitioners, for the more effectually quieting the possession of church property, and asking the protection of their rights and legal claims in and to said church property;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Geyer, Biser and Or-

rick.

The bill reported by Mr. Shower, entitled, an act for the relief of Carroll county;

Was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Geyer, said bill was referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to confer certain powers on the levy court of Worcester county, in relation to sundry poor persons in said county;

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed and

returned to the senate.

The unfavorable report submitted Mr. Dawson on the 13th inst. from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, upon the petition of Mary Manning, of Washington county, praying to be relieved of certain grievances therein mentioned;

Was taken up for consideration, and read the second time;

Mr. Mann offered as a substitute for said report, a bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of Mary Manning, of Washington county;

Which was read.

On the question being put—will the house adopt the substitute? It was resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Eastern Bank of Baltimore;

Endorsed 'will pass,' and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the promotion of education in Allegany county, by means of the poor school fund of said county; endorsed 'will not pass.'

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to amend the constitution and

form of government of the State of Maryland;

Endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments;'

Which amendments were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee that originally reported the bill.
