

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs at law of David Moore;

Endorsed, 'will pass,' and ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the rebuilding of the Millington bridge in Kent and Queen Anne's counties, endorsed, 'will pass with the proposed amendments;'

Which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to establish two additional election districts in Baltimore county, and for the general arrangement of the whole, so far as appellations and numbers are concerned;

Endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments;'

Which amendments were severally read the first time and ordered on lie on the table.

Also, the resolution relative to Hereford Academy;—endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed.

And, delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the senate, viz:

A bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to prevent gaming, passed Dec. session, 1826, ch. 88;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Julia Ann Stevens from her husband Charles B. Stevens;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

And, the following message—
