

Also, the bill from the senate, entitled, act for the relief of Mount St. Mary's College;

Also, the bill reported by Mr. Hearn, entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Worcester county to change the place of holding the election in certain districts in said county;

Also, the bill reported by Mr. Turner, of Caroline, entitled, an act for the distribution of the interest on the State's share of the surplus revenue, and to apply the surplus of the charity or free school funds to the purposes of common school education, so far as the same relates to Caroline county;

Also, the bill reported by Mr. Brown, entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned;

Also, the bill reported by Mr. Huddleson, entitled, an act to secure to the citizens of Allegany county the right of trial for debt under warrant, in the election district only in which the party so sued may reside;

And the bill from the senate, entitled, an act for the benefit of George Hildebrand,

Were severally taken up for consideration, severally read the second time, and severally passed.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill reported by Mr. Blocher, entitled, an act relating to public roads in Allegany county,

Were taken up for consideration, read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill reported by Mr. Powder, entitled, an act to repeal an act, entitled, an act to establish magistrates' courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, ch 201, passed at December session 1835, and the several supplements thereto, so far as relates to Carroll county,

Was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Sollers, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Higgins, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act regulating the manner of levying on the assessable property in Anne Arundel county for the support of primary schools in said county;

Was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Simmons, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.
