## WEDNESDAY, March 28th, 1838.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. On motion of Mr. Carpinter, the rule of the house which requires the journal of proceedings of the preceding day to be read, was suspended, and the reading of said journal was dispensed with.

The several bills, resolutions and messages which passed the

house on yesterday, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Risteau, chairman of the committee on divorces, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate entitled, an act to divorce Catharine C. Oldfield, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Thomas W. Oldfield,

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

Mr. Risteau, chairman of the committee on divorces, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of John W. Dexter, praying to be divorced from his wife Hannah R. Dexter,

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time

and concurred in.

Mr. Causin submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and with the resolution therein mentioned, sent to the senate:
